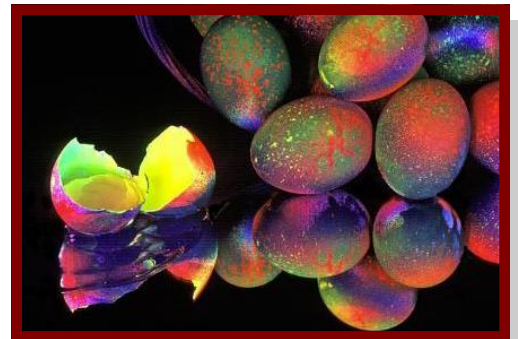

Alberta Wilderness Association (AWA) and Images Alberta Camera Club (IACC) *by Mufty Mathewson*

There is a little known treasure three hours northeast of Edmonton called Lakeland Provincial Park and its much larger area, Lakeland Recreation Area where there are more than 150 lakes. Lac La Biche is the largest community just west of the Park which was designated a bird sanctuary in 1902 and then, in 2001, became an important globally-designated Birding Area.

The Alberta Wilderness Association (AWA) is the oldest wilderness conservation group in Alberta. Dedicated to the completion of protected areas and the conservation of wilderness throughout the province, their motto is *"Defending Wild Alberta Through Awareness and Action"*. AWA realize the uniqueness of Lakeland and are working to preserve and nurture this unique area by recording the fauna, flora and landscapes with photographs.

The project began with Carolyn Campbell (AWA representative for the Lakeland Area) and seventeen photographers. Three photographers from IACC (Gerry Wirun, Shirley Hayday and Mufty Mathewson) drove north to meet at the home of Kent Davidson and Kirsten Sykes. They set up camp where they could enjoy a view of the lake from K&K's vast property. Early the next morning, Mufty and Gerry got away with Kent for a photo shoot in the Touchwood Campsite in the Lakeland Recreation Area. They crept up on shore birds (yellowlegs) and plant life while Kent launched his boat and did some fishing. Later in the day, Kent gave them a tour around the long shoreline of Touchwood Lake as this is the only way to access the area. Kent pointed out ducks by name, loons and beaver dams. Far away from everything he stopped the boat and there, in the tallest crux of an old dead tree, was an elegant, regal eagle. She sat on her enormous nest posing her white head, eagle eye and vicious beak one way and another for their cameras.

Kirsten met everyone back at the campsite with a hot dog picnic on the beach. Their two young tykes, Tianna (5), and Tanner (2) chased bubbles made by mum and dad - . . . what better wildlife shot is there than that? In the evening Shirley and Mufty wandered over to another eagle's nest on Kent and Kirsten's campground property. They captured (with their cameras!) both eagles coming and going from the nest in the evening light. Kent and Kirsten built a fire and provided marshmallows for everyone to enjoy while they entertained them with some fireworks. Kirsten's parents, who are avid birders, came along to talk birds and photography.

On Sunday morning, Shirley, Mufty and Gerry set off for Shaw Lake. Mufty got a deer standing stock still on the passenger side of the car. Shirley is a birder so she peeled out of the car with her camera gear and started to grin. "That's a yellow warbler", she said as she glanced up at the new green of the aspen woods, "and a chickadee, and a swamp sparrow." She was in birding heaven, hearing and finding song birds everywhere. Gerry and Mufty took off in opposite directions along the cleared snowmobile trails. All met an hour and a half later with more birds, grasses, flowers, lakescapes and landscapes captured on their multi-gigabyte cards. Mufty's find was a tiny new violet alongside some newly-green mosses. Gerry did a silhouette of loons and a pile of red shotgun shells emptied out onto the trail in the park (this is an important recording). Shirley found her yellow warbler, a swamp sparrow, a Nashville and an Orange-Crowned warbler. Both Mufty and Gerry were suffering from a case of lens envy when they saw the amazing magnification of Shirley's new Olympus 300mm lens bringing the tiny song birds into a full-frame view. When they got back to K & K's, they were directed to the north forty where they found the Osprey nest with a parent on board. She called her mate who came circling and they both flew about soaring on the wind, landing and taking off from the nest.

This feels like a fabulous beginning for both the Lakeland Recreation area and the Provincial Park (plus some Lac la Biche Eagles and Osprey). IACC members that would like to participate should contact Mufty (780.452.6224) and/or Gerry (780.456.2717) or Shirley (780.987.3096). The flower season is coming and each species needs to be recorded at different times of their blooming. Team up with someone and go. For directions to Kent and Kirsten's home, email Mufty at muftynbill@shaw.ca. Kent and Kirsten are the most welcoming family and are dedicated to this project's success.

Calling all Wildflower Photographers

I invite all photographers to take pictures this season (and even the next) of wildflowers, grasses and sedges that grow in Edmonton's river valley. I'd like to produce a laminated, fold-out leaflet showing small (but recognizable) photo portraits of our common river valley flowers that could be sold to the public at local outlets for a modest amount, say \$5. Such leaflets are often done also for birds, insects, aquatic life, etc. and are available at nature centres, visitor centres, bookstores, airport outlets, etc. I believe there are a number of groups as well as individuals who are asking for a simple, cheap guide to local plants.

The photographs should be dated, credited with your name, contact info and the location or habitat. (It isn't necessary for the photo to have been taken in the river valley but it must be of a species that is found there.) Identify the plant if you can and if not, I should be able to. (With grasses and sedges a pressed specimen may be helpful, as it isn't always easy to identify these plants from photos.) Photos taken previously are eligible.

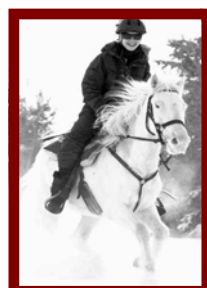
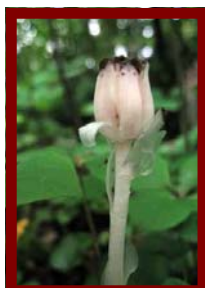
